College

School College Partnership (SCP) Courses

If you are moving into S4, S5 or S6 you can apply for a part-time college course as part of your school timetable. This means you would be in school Monday to Friday but would attend college on a Tuesday and Thursday afternoon (5th and 6th period). You can take a range of subjects including:

Engineering; Criminology; Electrical Skills; Hair & Beauty; Intro to Motor Vehicles (Mechanics); Intro to Social Science; Legal Services; Police Studies; Make Up Artistry; Sound Production; Photography; and many others.

Applications opened on the 31st of January and will remain open for 6 weeks. You must write a personal statement as part of your application as there are limited places. Two examples of this include:

- Engineering Academy: Engineering Systems Energy & New Technology. A Higher National Certificate (HNC) taken over S5 and S6. Applicants should be expecting to work towards at least Higher Maths and a Science.
- **Police Studies.** A HNC, again taken over 2 years, for pupils who are interested in developing a career where knowledge of the Police Service and Policing is important, such as the Prison Service, Private Security Firms, Social Services, Youth or Community Work and other uniformed services.

UCAS

The 'equal consideration' for UCAS applications has now passed (26th of January). If you have submitted an application, you will now start to receive offers from universities:

Conditional – the offer has conditions e.g., you must achieve certain results in the upcoming exams.

Unconditional – you have met the entry requirements and have been offered a place on the course.

Unsuccessful – you have not been offered a place on the course but don't worry, there are lots of options to consider including **UCAS Extra and UCAS Clearing**, **College**, **Apprenticeships**, and others!

Once you have received decisions from all your choices, you are able to make your decision(s). If you have received an unconditional offer from your first choice you can accept this which confirms your place on the course. If you have received a conditional offer from your first choice (or firm choice) you will be able to select a second choice (or insurance choice) as well*. You will then need to wait until your exam results in August to know if you have met the conditions for your first or second choice.

^{*}REMEMBER: Your second choice should always have lower conditions than your first choice.

Apprenticeships

If you in S6 or are considering leaving school at the end of this school year, you may also want to consider either a Modern or Graduate Apprenticeship. Apprenticeships can be a fantastic opportunity to:

- work full time gaining real life work experience whilst gaining key skills and expanding your networks
- gain a qualification (even up to a university degree for some types of apprenticeships)
- and earn a salary.
